



**TCH Past President Appointed to MCSAC**

TCH Treasurer and Past-President (2007-2008) Danny Schnautz (Clark Freight Lines) has been appointed to the Motor Carrier Safety Advisory Committee by Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administrator Anne Ferro.

The committee is under the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT), Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA). The MCSAC was established by the Secretary of Transportation on September 8, 2006, and is charged with providing advice and recommendations to the FMCSA Administrator on motor carrier safety programs and motor carrier safety regulations

The MCSAC membership is balanced and is comprised of fifteen experts from the motor carrier industry, safety advocates, and safety enforcement sectors from across the nation.

The members are appointed by the Administrator and serve two year terms and were chosen from a field of many qualified candidates who possess a wide range of motor carrier experience and expertise.

**Mexican Citizen Charged With Using Fake TWIC Card**

The U.S. Department of Justice is prosecuting one port worker for allegedly using a fake Transportation Worker Identification Credential card while working in a secure area at Port Fourchon, LA. That worker now faces a possible six-month jail sentence and a fine of \$100,000.

On Sunday, May 16, Eliazar Sanchez Castro, 24, of Port Arthur, TX, was leaving the port's secure area after working on scaffolding at the port when he realized he'd left his tools and baggage. Castro tried to re-enter the secure area when a port security guard noticed his TWIC card was fraudulent.




The guard also noticed that Castro's Texas driver's license was fake. He then detained Castro and called U.S. Customs and Border Protection. Castro told police he is a Mexican citizen, and said he'd bought his TWIC for \$150 to use while working offshore. Immigration officials have detained Castro for his suspected illegal presence in the U.S., U.S. Assistant Attorney Greg Kennedy said.

More than 1.5 million U.S. workers have enrolled in TWIC, including about 283,000 truck drivers. The program was created after the terrorist attacks on 9/11. Standard TWIC enrollment costs \$132.50, although workers with "current, comparable" threat assessment background checks such as hazmat endorsements, Merchant Mariner Documents or Free and Secure Trade (FAST) cards may obtain a TWIC card with a shorter lifespan for \$105.25. The card is designed to last five years with new background checks.

Thirty-seven percent of respondents in a recent landlinemag.com Web poll said their TWIC cards were checked always or "most of the time" at ports they visit. Twenty-nine percent said rarely, and about one third of respondents in the unscientific poll said their TWIC cards were never checked at ports they visit.





### Down the Highway – Trucking News

>Truck **DRIVERS**, not trucking companies, actually move the nation’s goods. Every industry



is sometimes guilty of overlooking the working level people, and trucking is no different. When

decisions are made, laws are proposed, processes are changed, then people’s lives often hang in the

balance. There’s a human factor that very often get missed. Let’s vow to fix that.

>**Just how far is the “last mile?”** It’s common to envision a very short haul of maybe 100 miles or less, but in fact, trucking ends up carrying loads hundreds upon hundreds of miles after another mode has stopped. Factors like the perishable nature of a load, available infrastructure, load value, and required timeliness all play a role in the decision.

>**Truck length of haul** is more fluid than transportation planners would like to consider. One volatile factor is fuel price; another is available driver pool and capacity of other modes which could be impacted by high water or a volcano eruption. In a good economy, customers are more willing to pay extra for faster service. Don’t write off the long-haul trucker yet.




