Port of New Orleans to Open Soon

Officials at the hurricane-battered Port of New Orleans say the Mississippi River was open to vessels going upriver and that the port may start accepting commercial traffic in as early as one or two weeks.

The Port of New Orleans' riverfront terminals are damaged, but are still workable once electrical power and manpower is available. The port expects to be largely used by military relief vessels in coming weeks.

For now, the Lower Mississippi is open only to ships with a draft of 35 feet traveling upriver during daylight hours. American Commercial Lines and Kirby, two of the nation's largest barge operators, say they suffered only minimal damage to equipment in Hurricane Katrina and they are able to operate in much of their inland waterway territory.

A handful of senior port staff members set up a headquarters at the port's administrative office building. They have asked the U.S. DO.T. Maritime Administration to provide ships with the capacity to temporarily house 1,000 people who will operate the port.

The port also asked staff members who have not contacted the port to call a special emergency hotline number to establish their safety and whereabouts. That number is 1-866-476-7866.

While the port may open, civil authorities have not been allowing commercial trucks into the Gulfport or New Orleans areas. Interstate 10 and US 90, the major commercial routes in Louisiana and Mississippi, were all but destroyed. Bridges and roads have been taken out through Louisiana and Mississippi. The Interstate 10 bridge over Lake Ponchartrain is impassable because 40% of it is missing.
